CONDITIONS OF ENTRY PERSONALITY & FUNDRAISER QUEST ENTRANTS

4 Sections

AGE GROUPS: As at 30th June of the quest year

JUNIOR: 10 years to 12 years

SENIOR: 13 years to 26 years

PRESENTATION: (horse & rider) – Judges to be organised by Zone Chief Instructor/ Regional Director of Coaching

PONY CLUB QUESTIONS: To be organised by Zone Chief Instructor/ Regional Director of Coaching. The questions are asked on the day at a set time and entrants are asked to ensure they complete their pony club events around their question time, marked out of 25 points. Horse and rider judging. Horse and Rider judged out of Entrants do not have to stay in their age groups throughout the Gymkhana as they can do their events with other groups. All entrants must compete in some events throughout the day. Once finished their events they can leave to attend to preparing for the night time events. Questions are marked out of

GENERAL KNOWLEDGE QUESTIONS: The quest coordinator to organise judges. A guideline for questions could include questions about surrounding area, present news headlines, political (eg: prime minister). Questions should be appropriate to the age of the entrants. Questions are marked out of 25 points.

GENERAL PRESENTATION & DEPARTMENT: The quest coordinator to organise judges. Entrants are judged on their general presentation and department and are marked out of 25 points. The organising committee is to notify entrants of the evening theme well in advance of the event.

FINAL TALLY: An independent scorer shall be appointed. The Zone secretary is to check scores. In the event of a tie placings revert back to the highest points in the Pony Club questions. If still a tie, 3 tie- breaker questions will be asked. Please ensure the zone committee and the quest coordinator only obtains the scoresheets from each category and assists each other with the final tally.

JUNIOR / SENIOR PERSONALITY: The entrant with the highest tally of points from all categories is declared the winner.

JUNIOR / SENIOR FUNDRAISER: A club cheque it to be presented to the Zone treasurer prior to the March Past. The entrant with the highest amount fundraised determines the winner of each category.

OVERALL FUNDRAISER: The entrant that raised the most amount of funds from both senior and junior determines the winner.

SASHES The winning sashes required:
 Junior Personality Junior Fundraiser Highest Overall Fundraiser
 Senior Personality Senior Fundraiser

The Zone Secretary is to organise, order and supply fundraising sashes. Sashes are sent to the entrants upon receipt of the entrants nomination fee. These sashes are to be worn at fundraising events and to the presentation dinner.

PRIZES Supplied by the Zone for all entrants. Eg. Good quality bridle.
 Presentations to the entrants are organised by the organising committee in consultation with the Zone Secretary.
 The major Prize for highest Overall Fundraiser is a Wintec 2000 saddle or prize of equal value.
 Organised and paid for by the zone committee.

TROPHIES & REPLICAS Are paid by the zone and organised by the Zone Secretary.

Communicate with entrants

Advise entrants of the schedule for the day

- Horse and rider presentation and judging (Time) & the names of the judges
- Entrants position in March Past (In front of Club)
- Entrants participation in events
- Time of Pony Club questions
- Time of general knowledge questions
- Time and venue of hairdresser
- Time and venue of Presentation and Department
- Order of events at the function
- Time for partners to arrive
- Dress for self and partner
- Seating arrangements for entrant and partner
- Types of questions to be asked when presented at the hall by the MC

Select a suitable MC for the evening.

Pre- prepare the MC to ask questions to entrants when they are presented at the function.

Introduction of Entrants from Junior to Senior.

MC to announce the procedure of the evening program.

Function to be organised by the Quest organising committee and to report to the zone at zone meeting:

- Ticket pricing
- Bookings- how to pay
- Caterers
- Bar/ Licence
- Tables/ chairs/ decorations
- Starting times

Host Club pays for the following;

Band / Evening entertainment

Catering/ decorations/ venue and associated costs

Host club receives all door takings

Zone pays for the following;

- ribbons
- sashes
- replicas
- meals for entrants and partners
- judges meals and partners
- accommodation for zone appointed judge
- major prize (Wintec 2000)
- entrants gifts
- ribbons to 4th place
- sashes
- replicas

Zone receives the nominations from both days as well as part of the fundraising as follows;
